HOLIDAY DECORATIONS

There are quite a few items around the house, that can be turned into attractive Holiday centerpieces. By just using the metal colored paints, copper, brass, silver, and gold. Any old plate, jar, pot, etc, can become a masterpiece.

For example, an old frying pan, painted with any of the above mentioned paints, a few ears of corn, some colorful fall leaves and a few acorns. A bread basket, painted gold, a few red apples, a bunch of grapes, and some gourds or leaves. A salad bowl, painted gold, brass, silver, or copper for fall; then a bright red coat of paint for Christmas. To this, add a few sprigs of pine or holly, some pine cones or berries and a tall red can-

dle. Any of these can make the ordinary salad bowl very attractive.

Candles—

To make your own candles, first you must have a mold. A glass without a rim, a cup, a milk carton, or any object from which the hardened wax can easily be removed.

For the color of your choice, break crayons into the melted wax. The color will become lighter after the candle sets.

To insert the wick, I use a hot ice pick to make the hole, always being careful not to crack the candle. Decorating the candle is the most fun. Here, you can let your imagination run riot.

A decal or a few plastic flowers can turn it into a masterpiece.

To paint on your own design, picture or initial, use melted crayon and a small brush. After it is completely dry, go over the design with liquid floor wax to make it shine.

Commercial glow wax can be bought in 10 lb slabs, or you can use the 1 lb packages of canning wax. Always use a double-boiler to melt wax. Just remember that it is highly inflammable, and children should be supervised if allowed to make their own candles.

To apply parchment paper pictures on candles, dip paper into melted wax and quickly place on candle. To frost a candle, let melted wax cool until a scum forms; then beat with egg beater until foamy. Apply with fork. If glitter is to be used, put on while wax is warm for the best results.

In addition to hearing local political candidates express their views the Federation heard Mr. Hale explain the proposed sewer bond referendum to be held on November 7th. 
