



A last call was made for volunteers to help circulate the petitions required as the first step in the **Traffic Calming Program**. The entire neighborhood, that's every street, must be canvassed. This is just a first step and does not commit us to agreeing to implement anything. Please note that this initiative was undertaken in an effort to address the concerns that have been raised at almost every PHCA meeting over the past several years about speeding and cut through traffic in the neighborhood. Residents come to meetings and expect the Association to help out. Well frankly, we're trying, but if nobody volunteers to help this effort will die. If this happens, the Association will clearly have a mandate not to make any further attempts for a good long while to address it any further and residents will be directed to take the issue up on their own with local officials. So please, consider contributing just a little bit of your time to this project. necessary) nutrients, transporting them from deep in the soil to their leaves and then to the topsoil through the breakdown of these fallen leaves.

And let's not forget organic matter. Organic matter, or humus, is volatile, meaning it breaks down over time, leaving an unreplenished soil less capable of holding on to nutrients and water. But by using compost to top-dress beds or by not bagging the lawn clippings, we increase the organic layer through simple leaching every time it rains. (And the dreaded "thatch" is a product of over-fertilization, not grass clippings left to organically feed the lawn.)

Next, let's clean up the annual and vegetable gardens. Removing the remains to the compost pile can reduce insects and diseases next year. And, in the case of the veggie garden, it gives you a head start when it comes time next spring to

plant your snap peas. If your garden is all ready to go this fall, you can dash out in March, hoe a quick row, drop in the peas and then scurry back inside before your hot chocolate gets cold. Believe me, I know!

I like to leave the perennial bed as-is until spring. The plant remnants serve two purposes: to catch and hold leaves that protect the dormant plants from winter's freezes and thaws; and to remind me next year of what's where!

And when you're done, head on down to the bookstore and buy yourself a present. I'd like to recommend a very enlightening, as well as entertaining book by Andy Wasowski, The Landscape Revolution, Garden With Mother Nature, Not Against Her. It's an easy-read with great photos, and I guarantee a chuckle or two. ☞

# The Pimmit Hills Gardener

Let's see, how does that old saying go? "Everyone talks about the weather, but no one does anything about it." And the talk seems to lean towards

"we're due for a bad winter." But I've been watching the woolly-bear caterpillars this fall and they don't appear to be setting any new trends in coat length this year. Who knows? But no matter what the winter will be like, we are getting down to the wire on fall chores. And believe me, there's nothing as shameful as

planting daffodil bulbs in January ... 'cept maybe planting them in April!

First thing, let's get out there before the Holidays and plant those flower bulbs. It's a whole lot easier to dig when the ground isn't frozen, believe me! The general rule is to dig a hole that's three to four times the height of the bulb. And the pointy end usually goes up; if in doubt, set it sideways and the emerging shoot will figure out

which way to grow.

If you find that the fall has slipped by and you've got a bag of ice-melt in one hand and a bag of bulbs in the other, you can plant

them (the bulbs) in a pot, shoulder to shoulder, set them into the fridge, or a cold, unheated garage or cellar, and then enjoy them in a potted display out on the porch or patio in spring.

Next, clean out your terra cotta pots and stow them where they'll be dry through the winter. Left sitting

outside, pottery often cracks or spalls when water inside the clay freezes. Believe me, I know! And drain those garden hoses and put them away.

Then start a compost pile with those leaves still sitting around. By raking, bagging and carting off our leaves and grass clippings to the dump, we are depleting our soil of needed nutrients. And trees are great movers of minor (but very

Now to get to more immediate neighborhood matters. I have noticed that some of our neighbors


